The IB career path is similar to that of alumni with a 'Maturité' diploma, for those students who obtain 32 points or more in the IB Diploma. For the others, their choices are most frequently; art schools, the hospitality industry, business and management (EHL, Glion, Vatel, BSL, Polycom, IFM, Webster, etc.), particularly for those who obtain IB 'certificates'. Finally, for both diplomas, the tendency to take a sabbatical year is increasing.
